From Adrian Lowe, Seminarian.

I used to be a budget holder for the last six years of my career in local government, and so had the responsibility of managing a sum of money each year for the people for whom I worked. I used to meet each month with an accountant and we would go through the financial spending and work out how much had been spent on everything from lighting to building maintenance and staff travel. I didn't really enjoy trying to work out where a penny had been lost! But it was good experience of how to use money in the best way possible: this is the theme of this week's gospel which has a number of sayings about how to use money well. We hear Jesus tell us to use money, 'tainted as it is, to win us friends,' and that we cannot serve both money and God, being the servant of two masters.

St. Luke was writing at a time when Christian communities which had been poor were now attracting richer members and there was a sense of division and class. Jesus admonishes us to use money wisely, but to also be as shrewd as worldly people when dealing with spiritual things. We are reminded in this passage of Jesus saying we should be as wise as a serpent but as innocent as a dove. The idea is the same – to use the things of this world in a spiritual way and to use spiritual things in a clever way for the purpose of the Gospel.

We cannot serve two masters – God and money, but using money in modern life is inevitable. The danger comes when we see some things as to do with God and others as worldly, leading to a kind of split spiritual life. God can be found in all things and if we can bring Him into every situation (with a short prayer as we pour over the accounting books) then we will hold Him in our hearts as our Lord and Master, and learn how to use all things for His glory.
