## TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A) **World Mission Day**

Week Commencing 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2023

In today's Gospel we have a good example of an attempted manipulation, the Pharisees hoping to trap Jesus whatever he says. Jesus dodges the trap and at the same time exposes their hypocrisy in that no Pharisee should have been carrying a denarius (on which was depicted the emperor who claimed to be a god). His own answer surprises them and they ca

n't think of anything to say. We have time to ponder Jesus' reply and it is puzzling, rather like his parables. Are we to alternate between two worlds, at times following the way of the world about us and at other times following the Gospel? Surely not. We have to work out a way, in our own circumstances, in which we can live in the world but not of it. The Gospel should always take priority and the world can be in harmony with the Gospel; nevertheless the witness of the martyrs shows that the two can clash and we have to make a choice for the Gospel regardless of the cost in worldly terms.

This beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima was blessed by Pope St Paul VI and given to our country by the Bishop of Fatima in 1968 to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the apparitions and to make known the important message of Fatima. Pope St John Paul II said the Fatima message "is the true Gospel of Christ presented anew to our generation... Let us receive the light that comes from Fatima, let us be guided by Mary."
