Fr Alex, RCJ, writes:

INCREASE OUR FAITH", the prayer most Christians always utter to God, a faith that is firm, deep and personal in order to sustain our relationship with Our Lord. We should all be connected with Him in the person of Jesus Christ [for without me you can do nothing. I am the Alpha and Omega]; the beginning and the end of all Christian life, therefore we should always be united with Him.
