In Brazil for World Youth Day, Pope Francis took time to visit the great Marian Shrine of Aparecida and he said Mass there. It shouldn't be a surprise that he too would "come to knock on the door of the house of Mary", since he has already demonstrated his great love and trust in Our Blessed Lady. Many of us had not heard of this holy place on the Paraiba River, yet in 2011 10 million pilgrims visited it! In 1717, three fishermen were in despair because they had failed to catch the fish that were desperately needed in the town. Praying to Our Lady, they put down their nets again and brought up a statue and then the head which had been detached from it. They wrapped it in clothes they had with them. They then found that their nets filled with the fish they needed. Pope Francis told the bishops of Brazil that he had prayed for them at the foot of this statue. He said "In Aparecida God gave Brazil his own Mother. But in Aparecida God also offered a lesson about himself, about his way of being and acting." After recounting the story, he went on: "Then, when God wills it, he mysteriously enters the scene, The waters are deep and yet they always conceal the possibility of a revelation of God. He appeared out of the blue, who knows for how long, when he was no longer expected. The patience of those who await him is always tested. And God arrived in a novel fashion, since God is wonder: as a fragile clay statue, darkened by the waters of the river and aged by the passage of time. God always enters clothed in poverty, littleness." He tells them: "Here there is a message which God wants to teach us. His own beauty, reflected in his Mother conceived without original sin, emerges from the darkness of the river. In Aparecida, from the beginning. God's message was one of restoring what was broken, reuniting what had been divided. ... The Church cannot neglect this lesson: she is called to be a means of reconciliation."

And then: "The fishermen do not dismiss the mystery encountered in the river, even if it is a mystery which seems incomplete. They do not throw away the pieces of the mystery. They await its completion. ... Then the fishermen bring the mystery home. Ordinary people always have room to take in the mystery. Perhaps we have reduced our way of speaking about mystery to rational explanations; but for ordinary people the mystery enters through the heart." As we approach the great feast of the Assumption of Our Blessed Lady, may we play our part in restoring what has been broken and in opening our hearts to the mystery of God.
