It would be strange if the gospel that we hear this week did not make us feel uncomfortable. Our Lord tells us that we cannot be his disciple unless we hate everyone else, including our mother, father, brother etc. What can this mean? It seems strange that it has come from the same Jesus who tells us elsewhere to, 'Love one another as I have loved you.'

The answer lies in the Aramaic language that Jesus would have spoken and that sometimes used two words with opposite meanings to emphasise a contrast. In this case, "hate" means "love less." In Matthew 10:37, Jesus makes the same point with softer words.

The writings of the rabbis at the time have other examples of using language in this way. Take a look at this example from a Rabbinic commentary on Exodus,

"By three names is this mount known: the mountain of God, Mount Horeb and Mount Sinai. Why The mountain of God? Because it was there that God manifested His Godhead. And Sinai? Because [it was on that mount] that God showed that He hates the angels and loves mankind."

God doesn't hate his angels; the writer is trying to show how much God loves humanity.

We can be comforted by this short lesson in Aramaic, but Jesus is still making a tough demand in this gospel as he asks us to love Him above all else. A good exercise before going to confession is to ask where we have preferred God to other things in our life and where the opposite is the case. The cost of discipleship can seem high, but when we make Christ our priority we find ourselves able to love God and all those around us with true freedom.
