In today's passage from the sermon on the mount Jesus addresses us as, 'the light of the world'. I am reminded of the Service of Light with which we begin the Easter vigil on Holy Saturday. The service begins after sunset, the church in darkness and the people gathered round the newly-lit fire outside. The priest lights the Paschal candle from the fire and at the doorway to the church sings, 'Christ our light' to which the people respond, 'Thanks be to God'. The priest then leads everyone into the church, priest and people repeating the sung dialogue twice more on the way to the sanctuary; the people's candles are lit from the Paschal candle and so the church is illuminated. The great hymn of joy, the Exsultet, is then sung, followed by the readings from the Old Testament read in the light of the Paschal candle, richly symbolic. We remember also that at an infant's baptism the parents and godparents are entrusted with a candle lit from the Paschal candle. There is much darkness in this world, every Christian is called to shed the light of Christ on that darkness, by what we say and do in our calling to be light to the world.

**Prayer For Peace.** We pray for the people of Ukraine and all war torn countries. For all those suffering or afraid, that you will be close to them and protect them. We pray for world leaders, for compassion, strength, and wisdom to guide their choices.

**UKRAINIAN EMERGENCY WINTER APPEAL:** Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason, a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine, which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis. The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.) It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal.
