Today's Gospel may be seen as a challenge to clergy, and teachers we could add. Jesus is, of course, addressing the religious leaders of his day so it is not correct just to apply his words indiscriminately to the present. After all, there are many teachers in the schools of this country; is Jesus saying we shouldn't call them teachers? Of course not.

What about the clergy of today? Here it gets more interesting, as clericalism is a real danger. I'd like to consider the difference between power and authority, a distinction which applies in many walks of life. A person may have power but no authority, in which case they are a tyrant and their actions are illegitimate; the Pharisees are an example. Conversely, someone may have authority but no power. Jesus has both authority and power, so his exercise of power is legitimate. An individual priest or bishop in this country arguably has power, they also need authority, which comes from who they are and how they strive to live and not just the position they occupy.
