THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) WEEK COMMENCING 6TH NOVEMBER 2022

The Sadducees, mentioned in today's Gospel, were one of the major sects within Judaism at the time of Jesus. They were associated with the Temple and therefore the priesthood, and were of high social status. One aspect of their belief was a literalist approach to the Law, in other words, claiming that one just had to read the text and follow what was written; and they would only believe what was literally written, on their understanding. The encounter with Jesus shows the basic weakness of this approach, such literalists project onto the written word their own presuppositions and prejudices. We see something similar today with those who claim to be Christian fundamentalists. A classic example would be Jesus' words at the last supper, 'This is my body'. Fundamentalists won't accept the obvious, literal meaning (real presence!) despite the absolute clarity of the words, because of their pre-existing prejudice against the real presence. Mis-reading of the Bible lies at the root of virtually every split between groups claiming to be Christian, hence the Catholic insistence that studying the scriptures is something to be done with humility and guidance. We might also remember that the devil quotes scripture, when Jesus is being tempted in the desert. PS the Sadducees became extinct with the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD.
