From Adrian Lowe, Seminarian

Last week, I was privileged to be one of the chaplains for World Youth Day, journeying in pilgrimage with about ninety young people from our diocese to Krakow in Poland for ten days of catechises, prayer and the sacraments which ended with a series of liturgies presided over by Pope Francis. The final Mass was truly a celebration of the diversity and universality of our Catholic Church with several languages used for the readings and an estimated 1.6 million people attending from all of our world!

The Pope said in the opening ceremony,

'It pains me to meet young people who seem to have opted for "early retirement". I worry when I see young people who have "thrown in the towel" before the game has even begun, who are defeated even before they begin to play, who walk around glumly as if life has no meaning.'

At another time during the week he warned the young about becoming 'couch potatoes' and urged them to become involved in politics and social activism to create a just world.

This seems to resonate with the gospel this Sunday where Our Lord tells us to be 'dressed for action and have our lamps lit' as well as, 'Happy those servants whom the master finds awake when he comes'. Perhaps the Pope's can words

speak to all of us, not just the young, as a kind reminder to be attentive to God and what He asks of us at all times. Our Lord came that we may have life in its fullest sense: no matter what our age or state of life, we can let the Holy Spirit transform our lives into one that is more dynamic, more loving and more giving to others.

Pope Francis went on to say:

"Whoever welcomes Jesus, learns to love as Jesus does. So he asks us if we want a full life: Do you want a complete life? Start by letting yourself be open and attentive! Because happiness is sown and blossoms in mercy".
