It is often said that for those who believe in God, proof is not necessary. For those who do not believe in God no proof is ever convincing. In today's Gospel the case is strongly made for all those who find it hard or even impossible to believe. When Thomas on his return is told by the other apostles that Jesus is alive again after his death on the cross he, quite understandably, refuses to believe. Thomas had witnessed that fearful and final death; he was in shock and in grief. He did not need false hopes. Whilst being part of the apostolic group, he is also a distinct independent self. He cannot be loyal to the group while being disloyal to his inner self. That would render his loyalty worthless and for Thomas, honesty was more important than loyalty. So when Jesus comes a second time to that upper room he invites Thomas to make the acid test. This is not a scold to Thomas but the gift of personal revelation. The disciples' faith is based on seeing; ours is based on hearing. Through preaching, teaching and witness of life many will come to believe. Through the story of the Church down the ages and the lives of good and holy people, through the simple living of those three great virtues given to us by God – faith, hope and love – many will come to believe. It remains equally true that many, like Thomas, have witnessed and undergone sufferings and sadness and are unable to believe; for others, philosophers and scientists, the whole religious theory just does not make sense. Others still, point to the follies and evils of religion. It was folly and religious evil which put Jesus on a cross. But the risen Jesus offers us faith; not religion. Faith is a life, and like any life can wither if not nurtured. Faith demands active verbs. That does not mean we will never have doubts; but if like Thomas we care about what we believe in, that care will bring us into the presence of the living Lord.
