FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (C) Week Commencing 9th March 2025

The Church sets before us in the Gospel of this first Sunday of Lent the temptations of Jesus in the desert as he prepares for his public ministry. The present translation is clearer that the forty days are not random but meaningful and in effect determined; Jesus is meant to stay there forty days. The other readings are not there accidentally. Thus, the first temptation is to satisfy a bodily need, seeking comfort one could say. The first reading refers to the Exodus and in particular the manna in the desert. We begin to see the contrast between the Israelites spending forty vears in the desert (years rather than days because of their disobedience) and their impatient yearning for bread to satisfy their bodily need and Jesus' patient obedience and resistance to hunger. The second reading also harmonises with the Gospel temptations, with Jesus rising above the way the Israelites acted. We have been baptised into a better kind of life than the Israelites, a different kind of Exodus, and Jesus' example is there to encourage us in that new life. God gives us all the grace we need.
