Fr Alex RCJ, writes:

Leprosy is a dreadful disease in the biblical times. In today's Gospel Jesus meets ten lepers who pleaded to be cured so out of his mercy and compassion he healed them. A truly remarkable scene isn't it?

Unfortunately the Gospel periscope did not end there. After some time one of the ten lepers came back to express his gratitude for the miracle received (a Samaritan). Jesus exclaimed ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? (Luke 17:17). One of the things that should be a part of our life is the attitude of gratitude.
