Last week Fr. Chis noted that coming to Holy Mass is not a favour to God but our Christian duty. Today's readings highlight how Holy Mass is a delightful duty for the grateful heart. In spite of all that we could complain about we have so much more to give thanks for and the Eucharist (Which means thanksgiving) is the ultimate act of thanks we can give to God. In the first reading Naaman the Syrian is a great military officer riddled with leprosy, after some reluctance he eventually humbles himself to wash in the waters of the Jordan and is cured. His flesh eating, disfiguring, leprosy, which would have cast him away from his family friends and community is a symbol of original sin. The washing in the Jordan waters is a foreshadowing of Baptism that cleanses us from original sin. Like Naaman, Grateful for our healing and salvation we can as forgiven sinners come to Holy Mass to give God thanks. In the Gospel, ten Lepers receive a healing from Jesus and only one turn's back to give thanks. This individual receives the complete blessing. Not only is his body healed but his soul as well. To him alone Jesus declares, "Your faith has made you whole." Gratitude writes Henri Nouwen deepens our consciousness that we are not an accident but a divine choice. God has chosen us in love let us respond to him in praise and thanksgiving, for it is truly right and Just.
