Fr. Alex writes:

Today the whole Church celebrates the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord Jesus Christ at the Jordan river by St. John the Baptist.

My dear friends, every time we think of Jesus's life and works including his baptism which is the prelude to his public ministry, we Christians, could not but stop to ask ourselves this question, why did he do it?

Based on our Catholic faith and Church teachings, the Sacrament of Baptism is an outward sign of God's goodness to us. Jesus, though he was in the form of God asked to be baptized because of his desire to be like us, except HE was without sin. He, as God is already complete, as a matter of fact, he lacks nothing. Yet, because of his great love for us he stripped himself of everything, thus giving us the possibility to share in his divine life.

Reflecting on this great mystery and connecting it with the gift of baptism which we all received by faith, we, Christians should try our best to live this life worthy of our calling and as 'demanded' of us to be holy as he is (1 Peter 1:16). Like Christ our mission is to fulfil the Father's will in whatever state we are in. Meaning, that everyday should be for us a commitment to be "light of the world and salt for the earth"

(Mt 5: 13-16). In this way, we can be real witnesses of Christ in words and in

deeds to our neighbours.

Let that water from the baptismal font which was poured on our foreheads remind us of our individual mission here on earth so that we can focus on how we should intensify our practice of faith, hope and love everyday. Let the AMEN we proclaim every time we receive his Body and Blood be our total YES to him who willed also to call us his beloved children.
