A psychologist once asked an audience, "If I squeeze this orange what comes out of it?" Without hesitation, someone cried back Orange juice! He then asked well why is that? To which someone else replied because that's what is inside of an orange. To which he said that is correct you do not squeeze an orange and get apple juice.
