It's a hot day, you have been walking miles, sweating buckets and now your throat and mouth are as parched as the ground beneath your feet, the dehydration is dire what you would do for a cool drink! Thirst is something we have all experienced. It exists both in our bodies and in the depths of our souls. In the today's Gospel the woman at the well encounters Jesus who reminds her that she has a bodily thirst that points to a deeper spiritual thirst. The thirst is deeper than this human well and consequently cannot be filled by any earthly water or wealth. In fact it goes further, as it has been fittingly said, wealth is like sea water the more we have the thirstier we become. The Catechism says that our thirst is real! Jesus first thirsts for us and that the cause of our thirst is a symptom Gods deeper thirst for us. Yes, we can take this thirst to different wells, but ultimately God has put in us a thirst that only he can satisfy. Lent is a time in the desert when we subdue the material thirst for things to awaken the deeper thirst of the spirit for God who alone can satisfy the deepest thirst of our hearts.
