NINETEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR [B] August 12th 2012

My Dear Friends

The Solemnity of the Assumption falls on Wednesday of this week. The divinely revealed truth "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, on the completion of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heaven", was proclaimed by Pope Pius XII in 1950. Far from being something pulled out of the hat by pious souls desperately seeking some way to take their minds of post-war austerity, the "falling asleep" or Dormition of the Mother of God was established in the East by the sixth century. The 15th of August was celebrated as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by the eighth century. Indeed, even in the fifth century the 15th of August was celebrated as the Commemoration of the Mother of God. Veneration of Our Lady is no invention of the so-called "Dark Ages" to be pruned back by those Church archaeologists who have never read Newman's "Development of Christian Doctrine" and think that a thing is legitimate only if it can be carbondated to the first century AD.

Reading "Munificentissimus Deus", the encyclical which defines the dogma, one certainly feels the passage of time: the six decades since have been marked by a disastrous loss of love and respect for Our Mother.

Pius XII speaks of the popular drive pushing the Church to define the dogma: "During the course of time such postulations and petitions did not decrease but rather grew continually in number and urgency. In this cause there were pious crusades of prayer." The faithful had seen the link between the dogma of the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption, illuminated by their instinctive love of her. "She, by an entirely unique privilege, completely overcame sin by her Immaculate Conception, and as a result she was not subject to the law of remaining in the corruption of the grave, and she did not have to wait until the end of time for the redemption of the body." (#6) Perhaps this is one of those dogmas God gives us in preparation for difficult times. In this regard it is similar to "Humanae Vitae" which clarified the perennial teaching of the Church in the area of sexual ethics just as dissent from Church teaching was gathering strength. Let us rekindle the love and fervour of those years before 1950. Queen conceived without Original Sin, pray for us. Queen assumed into Heaven, pray for us.

As last year, we will be joining with the Polish community in an indoor Procession and Mass of the Assumption, starting at 7.00pm on Wednesday. Next Sunday the Poles have invited us to join them at 4.00pm when the Mass will be **followed** by a Procession.
