## THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [A] [Remembrance Day]

What is the Lord asking of us in the Gospel? Stay awake, we might reply. However, all ten bridesmaids fall asleep, so the call to stay awake seems odd. It is principally a matter of translation, as 'awake' could also be expressed as, alert or watchful or ready; the verb also has the sense of 'rise up' (and relates to the word used for Resurrection). In the parable the key to being ready lies in the flasks of oil, that is all that distinguishes the two groups. We also need to note the place of the parable in the Gospel, the section to which it belongs gathers together several parables and exhortations from Jesus, all of which relate to the end of days. There will be a final reckoning for the whole world when Christ comes again, in glory, but before then people continue to meet their own end when they die. Jesus puts before us the certainty of God's final and complete victory when all will be made new and the Kingdom of God will be revealed in its fullness so as to provide the setting for our own life and hence our death. The flasks of oil represent the response we have made to God's grace in this life. The foolish bridesmaids have heard the Gospel, they can say, 'Lord, Lord' but they have not put the Gospel into practice, they have ignored grace. We might observe here that Baptism is a wonderful gift but it is not magic, none of the Sacraments are. The Sacraments are given that they might be used by us in order to build up God's Kingdom, otherwise we are merely standing idly by.
