Remembrance Sunday

Week Commencing 12th November 2023

We hear about the "Parable of the Ten Virgins" in the Gospel of today. Five of them are wise and the other five are foolish. Jesus uses the imagery of the ten virgins to convey a deeper spiritual lesson of being prepared. The last Sundays of the church are usually characterized by the Scripture texts about Christ's Second Coming at the end of the world and our inevitable death and judgment. Today's Gospel is one of them. Our lives here on earth will not last forever, but we are going to live forever. Our concern should be about where we are going to spend eternity. And so, we have to be as wise as the ten virgins, we have to be intentional about our lives as Christians and be attentive to the meanings of the times.
