WEEK COMMENCING 13TH MARCH 2022

From the temptation in the desert, to a glimpse of glory on mount tabor, God always gives us encouragement and strength for the journey. At a moment when the disciples are deeply discouraged by the talk of Jesus' suffering and death He takes them up a mountain and in their presence He is transfigured. This acts as a foretaste of glory to come and a present assurance of comfort and hope. This Lent we think of our brothers and sisters in the Ukraine. For millions, the shock of war is giving way to the horror of suffering and sadness, destruction and death; they desperately need help and need hope. God is not silent. In the Penny Catechism, question 137. It is asked, why should we hope in God? To which the answer is given; Because, God is infinitely wise, supremely powerful and entirely faithful to his promises. As in the first reading He promised childless Abraham that his children would be as many as the stars, He likewise assures David in todays Psalm, that He is our light and salvation, and again He speaks through saint Paul in our second reading to bravely endure hardships for our true citizenship is in heaven.
