

As the end of the liturgical year approaches, I thought I'd share some musings on the Gospel in light of the end of time and the ultimate meaning of history. Jesus tells us of perilous times to come. One might ask, how is that supposed to influence our living today? In his book The Lord, Romano Guardini interestingly observes that, if a curve was drawn to mark the high point of history, some would argue that its peak lies behind us in a distant golden age; that we are on a downward plunge to ultimate catastrophe. Others would argue the best days are in front of us with technological and scientific progress the peak lies ahead. Finally some might suggest that time itself is a matter of chance and process we need to take a hold of it and give it meaning ourselves. Guardini then says that while all of these contain a degree of truth and error for God the meaning of history lies in the fulfilment of salvation the accomplishment of his will. When the fullness of time has been attained, the end will come. The fine stonework of time will collapse to reveal with great clarity that the purpose of our lives was all along to know, love and serve God, to be happy with Him in this life and then forever in the next. Regardless of when the end comes, our challenge is to live His meaning now.
