St.John, in his Gospel, uses deceptively simple language. This Sunday's passage is a good example. Consider Jesus' question to the two disciples of John the Baptist, 'What do you want?' This could be taken in a very limited sense (rather like ordering food in a restaurant) or it could be taken more seriously and refer to their deeper desires, or indeed it could have both meanings. As a question it challenges each one of us, inviting us to look into our hearts and discern what it is we really want; this in turn raises the question, 'What ought we to want?' At this time of year many people make resolutions, aimed at changing an aspect of their lives but usually remaining as something superficial eg losing a few pounds. Jesus today asks us to confirm that we are his disciples, that we desire union with him. In the words of the penny catechism we could say we want to know, love and serve God in this world and be happy with him for ever in the next; a truly good new year's resolution.
