Week Commencing 14<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY 2021

From toys and takeaways to trainers and tracksuits, I would often ask my parents for many different things. In my mind, these were reasonable requests that I had a right to and moreover my parents had a responsibility to get these things for me, right? Wrong! Even the good things that I made requests for were to be given and received as gifts. My Parents knew the importance of grounding me in reality and growing me in humility. St Augustine says If you want to build a tall house of virtues, you must first lay the deep foundations of humility. What I love about the Leper in this Sunday's Gospel is his humility. "If you want to you can make me clean" In this single sentence we see that the leper knows that God holds both the prerogative and the power to heal. Some got their healing by touching his garment; others by calling out in desperation, this leper however, received healing by approaching God in humility. God is desirous to give us good things; this Leper is an example for us to consciously choose humility trusting in God's goodness, God's timing and God's will. Choosing humility is overcoming the social distance of our pride, escaping the isolation of our sin and embracing the vaccine of virtue to inoculate us from the virus of vice. God loves us more than anybody else can or does. In his response to the leper, (of course I want to) Jesus reveals our healing is his heart's desire. With confidence and humility, let us seek the will of God.

**THE POPE'S INTENTIONS FOR FEBRUARY: Violence Against Women**

We pray for women who are victims of violence, that they may be protected by society and have their sufferings considered and heeded.

**MARRIAGE MATTERS:** (Leviticus 13:1-2, 45-46 1 Corinthians 10: 31-33, 11:1 Mark 1:40-45) ***Keeping our love alive.*** Sometimes we have a sense of being at odds and separated from each other. The question, often unasked, is 'do you love me?' The answer is the same as Jesus gave to the outcast leper 'of course I do!' From being apart, we can be one again. How often do we say to each other, 'I love you'?

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Despite all the restrictions, let us be thankful that we can once again gather together, despite social distancing, as God's people. Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment :-

- Churches will open 15 minutes before start of Mass
- Facemasks must be worn when entering all places of worship (unless medically exempt)
- Entrance to Church will be via the main door, exit by the side door
- Hand sanitiser is available at entrance and exit, though you may bring your own
- It will be essential that people sit where they are asked and do not move from there
- The use of face covering/mask in Church is now mandatory (please don't forget yours when attending Church) and that you wear it so that it covers both your mouth and nose.
- Social distancing must be maintained at all times within Church.
- An Offertory Collection box will be situated at entrance and exit; the donation station is also useable
- No touching of Statues or Images in Church
- Toilets will be closed except for genuine emergencies.
- We are still required to have Church Stewards in attendance at each Mass and the Church will be cleaned after each Service in readiness for the next Mass to be held.
- No mingling with other people you do not live with after Mass outside the Church.

**THE PARISH STEWARDS ARE HERE TO HELP AND DIRECT YOU TO YOUR SEAT(S), PLEASE BE POLITE TO THEM AS THEY CAN ASK YOU TO LEAVE THE CHURCH IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY WITH PRESENT GOVERNMENT AND DIOCESAN REGULATIONS.**

*Anyone displaying symptoms of Covid-19, or who has reason to believe that they have been in contact with someone who has, should not attend church or volunteer in any capacity until they have received medical advice that it is safe to do so.*
