Love her or loath her, Baroness Thatcher cannot be ignored even in death. One of her principles was that of freedom in the economic and social spheres. For those of us born under the shadow of the Soviet Union and state monopolies at home, this idea of freedom was very attractive. Freedom, however, is not in itself a virtue. Yesterday's cure often becomes today's poison. A new generation does not remember the Iron Curtain or Lady. The vocal opponents of the pro-life movement would be horrified to think they were Thatcher's children, but their mantra "a woman's right to choose" is part of her legacy. George Weigel, the biographer, considers Mrs Thatcher, Ronald Reagan and Blessed John Paul II to be the key players in the peaceful dismantling of the Soviet Bloc. What the great Polish pope taught was the value of the human person. He stressed the dignity we have being created in the image of God. And the Church is the supernatural society, resisting the socially corrosive effects of more than one 20th century ideology.

The price of freedom is eternal vigilance. We can see in the West moves to curtail that freedom. One of the well-founded fears about the Same-Sex Marriage Bill is that to voice the Church's teaching on sex within marriage between one man and one woman will become a "homophobic" crime.

Even more important is interior freedom. It kept sane those imprisoned in the Gulags. Freedom from sin, found on our knees before Christ's representative in the Confessional, restores innocence, giving us a lightness of heart. Freedom is not simply freedom to choose, but freedom to choose to do the right. Freedom to become the people God wants us to be. Our choices are not equal. They have consequences, not just in this life. Some lead to eternal perdition, others to eternal happiness in the presence of God. May we thank God for our freedom, defend it and exercise it with the dignity of children of God.
