THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY ^(C) WEEK COMMENCING 14[™] AUGUST 2022

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary implies the bodily taking up of the Virgin Mary into heaven, at the end of her earthly life. This doctrinal belief is part of the treasury of the Roman Catholic Church, Eastern Orthodoxy, Oriental Orthodoxy, and parts of Anglicanism. The Catholic Church teaches as dogma that Mary having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. This doctrine was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950, in his Apostolic Constitution "Munificentissimu Deus" (the Most Bountiful God). In 1950, Pope Pius XII was not declaring the Assumption belief as something new. There are written evidence of the belief in Assumption as early as the 4th century in texts that cover several languages and global geographical coverage. The teaching of the Assumption of Mary became widespread across the Christian world, having been celebrated liturgically as early as the 5th century in the East. It was celebrated in the West under Pope Serius I in the 8th century, and Pope Leo IV confirmed the feast as official. However, theological debate about the Assumption continued, following the Reformation, climaxing in the 1950 when Pope Pius XII defined it as a dogma for the Catholic Church. Scripture does not explicitly give an account of Mary Assumption into heaven. Certainly, we know that Mary is the Woman who is caught up in the battle between the devil and the world according to Revelation 12. Mary is the epitome of Christianity and the embodiment of Jesus. Her immaculate womb is the first tabernacle, and she still constantly holds Jesus in heaven. Seminarian – Moses
