WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

People often like to know what might happen in the future, both the short term e.g. weather forecasts and the long term e.g. climate change. The obvious difficulty is the uncertainty which surrounds the future. The Old Testament developed a language to talk about future divine acts, apocalyptic, which actually means 'hidden'. This can be considered as a kind of code, a shorthand. In the New Testament we have the final book of the Bible, the book of the Apocalypse, concerned with what is still to come. The readings today use some apocalyptic language, referring to different events. Speaking in the early days of the first century Jesus gives us hints about the short term, which referred to the coming of the Holy Spirit and the destruction of Jerusalem; also the longer term which we call the second coming. The Holy Spirit has come, demonstrably in power on the day of Pentecost and powerfully since though in a more hidden way; and Jerusalem was destroyed, in AD 70. So we can be sure that Jesus will come again, in glory. As we await the second coming our attitude ought to be one of readiness, focussed on the present. As has been said before, if we are ready, then it does not matter if the second coming is in our days or not. The future is a mystery, the present is a gift.
