This year SPUC is focusing on the protection of school children from sexually explicit materials. This pro-Life movement is known for its sterling work against abortion and when you think about it the connection is obvious. Explicit sex education, to quote their material, "primes children for teenage sexual relations". When that happens, abortion is available – without parents knowing - when things "go wrong". The Christian family is the domestic Church, and this government policy is an attack on it. Please take the time to inform yourselves about these dangers to our children and, if nothing else, pray for their innocence and the protection of the family.

The public was "softened up" for the *Abortion Act* of 1967 by plenty of hard cases (which as we know make bad law) and a sustained media campaign. The same is happening today with euthanasia and assisted suicide. SPUC are active in this area too. Tony Bland, the Hillsborough disaster victim left severely brain-damaged and fed through a tube, was one such "hard case". This challenge involved the withdrawal of "artificial nutrition and hydration" – in other words denying the patient food and water through a tube. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in August 2007 gave an authoritative answer to a specific question on this topic: "A patient in a *permanent vegetative state* is a person with fundamental human dignity and must, therefore, receive ordinary and proportionate care which includes, in principle, the administration of water and food even by artificial means". John Paul II was a testimony in his final days to genuine dignity in suffering. Never cease praying for those who are about to pass from this life to the next. Alison Davis is the national coordinator of the "No Less Human" group within SPUC and has an inspiring story of living with disability, including resisting the temptation to commit suicide. There are many fronts to this battle for life and you will find some literature at the rear of the church to inform you, including her story. We all have a duty to form our consciences according to the teaching of the Church. We must in particular pray for health workers so that they are prepared when the challenges come. Let's support the work of SPUC in promoting the culture of life.

Life is precious because it is a gift from God and we are made in the image and likeness of our Creator. Our bodies are not our own but are temples of the Holy Spirit. We receive into these bodies the Bread of Life, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Blessed Lord, every time we come to Communion. Let us defend, indeed proclaim, the infinite value of human life from conception to natural death. Let's support SPUC to this end.
