### SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME [A]

May I invite you this week to reflect on the baptism of Jesus as we are about to enter already into the Ordinary time of our liturgical season.

Brothers and sisters, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan river by John was a prelude to the most awaited beginning of his public ministry. He took upon himself this gesture of cleansing to show us his unconditional solidarity with us sinners. And this is the greatest novelty of our reflection last Monday during the feast of Baptism of Jesus. Accordingly, that even though Jesus did not sin, still he deigned to undergo the baptism of repentance through John the Baptist. God being baptized by a creature?! What a humility! But instead of himself being cleansed, he rather sanctified the water of Jordan. And with this sublime gesture of self-abasement, brothers and sisters, we see that he did not underscore his being God and his divine origin, but rather he showed his being one with us who have sinned much and who are guilty of many things and demonstrates our helplessness without God's forgiveness.

Having this before us, I guess we could say now that Jesus' baptism is thus no mere ritual or show-of, but rather it is a "prolepsis", meaning a flash forward of what this man would become when he will enter into the paschal mystery....into his passion, death and resurrection. Our baptism, therefore, is related to this calling whereby we need to die to ourselves in order to win our victory over sin.

Thus, Jesus became the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world in order to save us out of love for us.

Let us thank Jesus everyday of our lives, for without his self-sacrificing love, we for sure are not able to receive the graces needed for our salvation.

Lastly, let us recall the formula of our baptism which simply means, "I am God's":

I baptize you (name of the person to be baptized) in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
