This Sunday's Gospel is often, in my opinion, misunderstood. People commonly latch onto the word, 'talent' and immediately think of talent as in Britain's Got Talent. The word doesn't mean that at all, it guite simply refers to a large sum of money. We should note that the money is given to the servants in proportion to their ability. In other words, the master is giving his servants work to do, more ability means more work to do. The lazy servant has the ability to do something useful and fruitful for the master but declines to act. The parable applies to each of us today, we are all asked to work for the Lord, not that everyone has to do the same amount but everyone can do something. Another way of looking at this is to recognise God's generosity, we are freely given grace (without which we can do nothing) yet are invited to cooperate with God in 'using' that essential grace. We're called, not to be passive spectators of salvation but to be co-workers with God in the Church. his hands and feet in service of others. Fr. Chris

Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment:-
