At the end of her earthly life Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven. Catholics are often accused, wrongly, of denigrating the body. It is true that there is a tradition, going back to the earliest days of the church, of 'mortifying the flesh' and this is interpreted, wrongly, as hate for the body. The truth is that we have a genuine respect for the body, which is why we recognise the importance of achieving harmony, as far as possible, between body and soul. We might call to mind Pope St. John Paul II's teaching on the theology of the body, a series of weekly homilies turned into a book; well worth a read. We might also question the worldly view of the body, supposedly better and more correct than ours - strange that we see so much bodily abuse e.g. drugs, alcohol, sex, over-eating, lack of exercise etc.; and that curious expression, 'I can do what I like with my body', which reveals that people do think of their bodies as things to be manipulated. The Assumption shows God's respect for us as body and soul, let us do likewise. Fr. Chris

**ST HELENA (Patroness of Colchester)** Feast day: Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> August. Saint Helena is the patron of divorced people, empresses, difficult marriages, converts, and archaeologists. She played an important role in the history of early Christianity, as the mother of Constantine the Great and at the age of 80, she led a group to the Holy Land in search of the True Cross. They unearthed three crosses and had an afflicted woman touch all three. One of them immediately cured her and therefore they decided that that cross must be the True Cross. St. Helena then sent pieces of the cross to Rome and Constantinople. It is very fitting that Helena, the mother of a Roman Emperor who converted to Christianity, should be associated with Colchester, Britain's oldest town.

**FR TOM JORDAN, RIP.** After 31yrs as a priest of Brentwood Diocese, serving in Grays, Leigh on Sea, Basildon and Romford, Fr Tom sadly passed away on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> August.
