TWENTY- NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME ^(C) Week Commencing 16^H October 2022

The three great Christian virtues are of course faith, hope and charity. We hear a lot about faith and charity, whereas hope seems to be a poor relation. This might be because of the worldly use of 'hope' which has nothing to do with the virtue, worldly hope being wishful thinking. In today's Gospel Jesus asks that the disciples persevere in prayer, and this could be broadened into a general appeal to persevere as Christians, which seems to me to be a matter of hope. The widow in the Gospel parable this Sunday doesn't give up, she expects to get what she is after even if it takes a long time. So it is with us. God has promised us much, some in this world and the fulfilment of all the promises in heaven. Our journey therefore is made in hope, an utter conviction that God will give what he has promised, in his own time. If God delays to act, as we might see it, we need not worry since he is faithful and we shall receive at the favourable time. This is not wishful thinking but rather, in the words of a well-known hymn, all our hope on God is founded.
