SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C) WEEK COMMENCING 17TH JULY 2022

The language and setting of the story of Martha and Mary are reminiscent of the social custom of ancient Jewish hospitality, derivable from the culture of the ancient oriental world, in reference to love and kindness shown to strangers and visitors. We read of Martha and Mary on three biblical occasions, each of which reveals different facets of their responsive characters. These include today's Gospel, Luke 10:38-42, and the Gospel of John chapter 11. They lived with their brother Lazarus in Bethany, a small village, an easy commutable distance to the old city of Jerusalem via the Mount of Olive. In John's account, Jesus loved Martha and Mary and wept over Lazarus' death and consequently raised him to life. Mary used the occasion of Jesus' visit to listen to him with rapt attention. Jesus responded to Martha not on the basis of her service of hospitality, but for not first paying attention to him. This Gospel passage is an allegory of the active life of Martha and the contemplative life of Mary. Martha honoured Christ through her work, and Mary through her single-minded devotion. Jesus did not blame Martha for being concerned about household chores. Jesus was only simply asking her to set her priorities right. In view of household Christianity, women host the Church in their houses. It is easily possible for our service to Christ and His Church to degenerate into mere busywork that is no longer full of devotion to God. Remember, whenever Jesus is our guest, He becomes the dominant figure and answers all our questions.
