Recently I was shown the first edition of an underground magazine from the 1970s, published and circulated at great risk to the young people involved. Some of those involved now belong to our parish. I touched the original pages of this magazine with the utmost respect. People had been ready to die for these words. They wanted freedom of expression to bring truth and justice to Poland under the oppression of the Soviet Union. Those brave souls wanted rational debate such as Karol Wojtyla gave them.

We are still digesting the horrible scenes in France where people have died because of what they wrote and sketched. There was something heart-warming about so many people gathered last weekend in Paris to protest against the violence, with politicians linking arms in solidarity with the victims. Defiance against attempts at censorship imposed by brutal means: we can agree with that. Freedom of expression, however, is only a means to the end of justice and truth. To defend the right to blaspheme a religion in the most crude and bestial manner is the wrong cause. "Je ne suis pas Charlie", I am not Charlie, because the magazine is not a responsible criticism of Islam or religion in general. In fact it has made rational analysis more difficult.

Remember the academic paper Benedict XVI gave to his old university of Regensburg in 2006? He quoted the words of a Byzantine emperor in 1391, sparking violence against Christians across the world. (Who gathered then in defence of the pope's freedom of speech?) The emperor condemned Mohammed for the use of the sword in spreading his faith. He went on to say: "Violence is incompatible with the nature of God and the nature of the soul. "God", he says, "is not pleased by blood - and not acting reasonably is contrary to God's nature.

Faith is born of the soul, not the body. Whoever would lead someone to faith needs the ability to speak well and to reason properly, without violence and threats... To convince a reasonable soul, one does not need a strong arm, or weapons of any kind, or any other means of threatening a person with death." Read the whole lecture on the Vatican website.

Muslim teaching is that God transcends even reason. The Prologue to Saint John's Gospel is our reply: "In the beginning was the Word (Logos)". Logos means reason capable of expressing itself. The young people in 1970s Poland knew that the forces of unreason would fail. They will fail again today, whether secular or religious. Reason, the Word, has taken flesh and dwells among us. He brings harmony, peace and true freedom. May we be witnesses to Him, expressing it in what we say and do!
