## ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)

*Day for Life*

Week Commencing 18<sup>th</sup> June 2023

*Jesus looked out at the crowds and was moved with compassion for them.*

St John Paul II said that he did not like the word "crowds" it seemed too anonymous and impersonal he preferred the word multitude. The difference? Well, the catechism teaches that Jesus personally knew and loved each of us during his earthly life. All the infinite depth of our fears, hopes, joys and experiences of our hearts were being treasured by Jesus. Indeed, St Paul would tell the Galatians "*He loved me and gave his life for me.*" While a great crowd can be an emotional and exciting experience, for the lover of souls and those who have cultivated a contemplative outlook the wonder of the individual person is infinitely more amazing and awe-inspiring. The Psalmist reminds us that we have all been fearfully and wonderfully made, unique, irreplaceable and unrepeatable. In the face of such a profound truth St John Paul would write that the only adequate attitude to the human person is love. On this Sunday, we celebrate that the only adequate response to every human life from the moment of conception until life's natural end is love. Whilst the circumstances surrounding pregnancy can be traumatic, stressful and very painful, we are never without hope. I personally know many good people who have laid down lives and resources to help families and individuals choose life. Equally for those who have not chosen life Rachel's vineyard is one of several organisations that looks out at the multitudes to see and love the individual offering healing, help and hope.
