## TWENTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR [C] - 18th August 2013

Parish Mass Book - Page 124

My dear friends

Though we are celebrating the Twentieth Sunday of the Year, we can remember that August 18<sup>th</sup> is the Feast of St Helen – who is the patron saint of Colchester and from the early 1900's has been the patron saint of our church, along with St James the Less. It was good to be together to celebrate at our parish barbecue on Saturday, anticipating our patronal feast.

Helena (Helen) was born circa 250-255, almost certainly at Drepanum (Helenopolis) in Bithynia, Asia Minor. However, another tradition, originating in England in the twelfth century, claimed her to be a native of Britain, the daughter of King Coel, hence her association with Colchester, the oldest town in the country. Helen was of humble origins but became the wife of the Roman general Constantius Chlorus circa 270. In 274, their son, Constantine, was born.

In 292, when he became Emperor of Rome, Constantius Chlorus divorced Helen for political reasons. However, when her son Constantine succeeded as Emperor in 306 (the proclamation was made at York in that year) his attitude to his mother was to treat her with great respect. Helen converted to Christianity circa 312, the Church was accorded toleration throughout the Roman Empire in 313, and Helen spent the remainder of her life seeking to promote the spread of Christianity. As an elderly woman she journeyed to the Holy Land, spending much of her fortune on almsgiving and the foundation of churches on holy sites. From the fourth century onwards, and particularly through the preaching of St Ambrose of Milan, she has enjoyed a special link with the finding of the Cross. The date of her death in the Holy Land is circa 330. She was buried in Rome. In Christian art St Helen is always depicted holding the Cross of Calvary. May St Helen pray for us.
