Jesus enjoins us to be perfect, just as our heavenly Father is perfect, what can we make of this? The Pharisees were dedicated to perfection, seeking to fulfil the Law to the letter and we all know how Jesus viewed them. We also have a phrase from St.Paul, much later of course, that he isn't trying for perfection by his own efforts. Again, the word 'perfect' is a translation of a Greek word, are there any shades of meaning to explore? What we find is that the word has the sense of wholeness, completeness, being undivided and therefore the idea of fulfilment. We could consider the situation where someone is physically ill, what they seek is wholeness, being complete again, in full health; to do this very often involves something and someone from outside. medicine and a doctor. So, to be perfect for us involves recognising we are sinners in need of grace, desiring to be whole through God's forgiveness and healing. We can also say it means to be fully human. We won't be perfect in this life yet desiring it should be a priority. The Father, of course, is perfect.
