It is true to say, I would argue, that a person's outlook determines how they interpret a situation and therefore also how they act. An extreme example would be paranoia, a condition which is essentially incurable in its more severe forms. Today's Gospel is a story of two different outlooks. The two servants who trade with the money entrusted to them exhibit confidence in themselves and a relationship with their master which is basically good since they are presumably prepared to risk losing the money and therefore facing the master's response to a loss. The third servant starts from a different outlook, concentrating on what he has heard, not his own experience, and retreating into fear and inaction. How could he enter into his master's happiness when he views his master so fearfully? We can apply the parable to the people of today. Some see God as a loving Father and so joyfully go about his business, they become his co-workers in bringing about the Kingdom of love, joy etc. Others see religion as all about rules and sanctions and refuse his invitation to join in the work of creation. The truth is, God desires and invites each and every human being to freely and joyfully take a real part in creation; in the words of one of the Fathers of the Church, 'God became man so that man might become God'.
