Brothers and sisters reflecting on the Gospel story this Sunday, I can't but connect this to last Sunday's Gospel. St. Peter expressed to Jesus more or less a similar thing like the Canaanite woman did in the Gospel this Sunday. Peter exclaimed "Lord, save Me". the Canaanite woman said: "Lord help me".

Both of them ask help from Jesus. Now, just like anybody else we, too, very often express the same emotion of supplication over and above a situation when we feel helpless. We sometimes cannot handle pressures brought about by life's trials and difficulties. Therefore, we resort for help. Like them we need a person like Jesus to come to our rescue.

The trials of life, in great or in small ways, test the depth of our faith and trust in God. That is why the woman offers us an example on how we should keep our faith in God. First of all, she loved her daughter which is why she was determined to do everything for her. She is not asking favour for herself but for the sick daughter tormented by a demon. This was her motivation in wanting to speak with insistence to the loving, compassionate heart of Jesus; she believes that Jesus at that moment is the only person to turn to and no one else.

Yes, my dear friends, a person of great faith and love can always express a sincere prayer for God, and God is always ready to listen to it. He or she can only move the heart of Jesus if it is done with a full heart as well. That is why she didn't mind the disciples of Jesus who wanted to drive her away, rather she continued to ask him with persevering heart. She was not bothered either when Jesus refers to her

as a dog that eats the scraps from the masters' table. Instead, the Canaanite woman humbled herself. Great proof of her right intention, and genuine trust in the Master of life.

How about us, how do we ask? Like St. Peter who asks..."Lord save Me? And this woman "Lord help me"? Remember when man prays sincerely the compassionate heart of God becomes very soft. For our sincere and humble prayers are his weakness.
