In the film, 'Dead Poets' Society' a key phrase of the central character (a teacher) is, Carpe Diem, seize the day. Some of the pupils respond and are changed. In today's Gospel Jesus begins his preaching with a reference to time. The Greek word used is Kairos, which doesn't refer to clock-time, it is a matter of being the right time to act, the appropriate moment, because the Kingdom, or Reign, of God is at hand. There is an urgency in Jesus' words, even though the Kairos has continued for 2,000 years; the Gospel cannot merely be ignored, a person's attitude to it is decisive for good or ill as they respond or not as the case may be. This is reflected in the word, repent, which is a call to radical change. St.Paul encountered the Word and it changed the whole of his life, from persecuting the early Church to being a central character in its development. Carpe Diem.
