

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (B)

We have just set out on our Lenten journey, again; Holy Lent as the Church describes it, a journey towards the celebration of Easter. As we undertake our penances etc. in this season, may we keep Easter very much at the forefront of our minds and hearts, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ together make sense of all that we are doing in these forty days.
