### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT (B)

Week Commencing 21st March 2021



In the reading from Hebrews we encounter the phrase, 'He (Jesus) learnt to obey through suffering'. What might this mean, as it seems a strange thing to say? We can recall that the root of 'obey' is a verb which means, 'in the direction of hearing'. In other words, a person hears and, in obeying, acts on what they hear; the familiar phrase, 'I hear and I obey' comes to mind. If what a person hears is pleasant, obeying is most likely straightforward. In such cases, the obeying isn't much of a test, the will of the person speaking and the will of the hearer readily coincide. When it comes to something unpleasant, suffering is involved, then the obeying probably isn't quite so straightforward. In those cases, the person really does learn to obey, to submit their will to that of the other. Jesus learnt to obey through suffering, the obvious question we can ask ourselves is, how well do we do? Do we obey when it suits us, when what is requested fits with our own ideas, and disobey when we don't like the request? Or do we learn to obey through suffering. Like Jesus?
