From Adrian Lowe, Seminarian.

In the Gospel this week, we find a group of people who had assumed they will be saved being told that this is not the case with Jesus saying, I do not know where you come from.' Jesus begins this discourse as an answer to a question about how many people will be saved. This same question has probably crossed every Christian's mind at some point in their spiritual lives, or we may have been asked it by someone else. It was also a concern of the Pharisees, where the question was around if a Jew who was not faithful to the law and covenant could enter into eternal life.

Jesus asks us to try to enter through the narrow door to obtain salvation and this may be a good time to think about the Year of Mercy and the holy door. The Holy Father has granted a plenary indulgence this year which we can obtain by entering through one of the holy doors which are in every diocesan cathedral, along with receiving communion, going to confession and praying for the Pope's intentions, but perhaps we can also reflect on the holy door as a symbol of the door of mercy in our own hearts, inviting us to be open to others, especially those who are most in need of God's forgiveness, mercy and love and also our own forgiveness, mercy and love. In our faith we are asked to cross the dangerous threshold of love - of having hearts open to loving others when they cannot love us in return.

Perhaps this is the narrow door that Jesus is speaking about today, a door which is difficult to pass through and even at times a struggle, but one which leads to the feast in the Kingdom of God.
