One of the most important things to remember about Jesus' mission is his great interest in spreading the Good News. His priority is the preaching, while the healings come after.

Many a times, Jesus would gather first the people to himself as his listeners and tell them about the Good News, like for example, the call to repentance for the kingdom of God, which shows the mercy of his Father. He would also speak about the light the people should have in order not to live in darkness; about the love of God and neighbour which are indispensable for someone who believes in his Father, and the acts of charity (big or small it may be) which are expressions of one's faith, to name a few.

Many of us Catholics know about many things of our faith from our childhood catechism classes. Some of us would even declare that their faith journey is fine and smooth sailing, and therefore they need no further studies and knowledge other than what they have, or they may think they have. But wait, remember that this "Knowing" is different from "Owning-Living" the Bible. We may know it through and through, through our daily reading and yet we remain far from living it. We may know and talk about Jesus and what he did and would and could do for us, but if we do not talk to Jesus and with Jesus all this is nothing. We are just like a clanging cymbal as St. Paul would put it.

Coming to this consideration, I believe that everyone should be reminded of this dictum: "Text without context is pretext". We will never see and understand the true

meaning of the passage if we do not go back to its cultural context and to the intention of the Holy Writers.

This thing in my opinion is indispensable for a correct way of praying the Bible.

Today we need people who know how to defend themselves from the fast growing and numerous challenges of our faith. We need real witnesses who can stand for their faith amidst the culture of individualism, consumerism, communism and relativism with the Bible as their armour.

Lastly, let us pray that we learn to love the Scripture and to use it as the daily source of our inspiration so as to be guided in our everyday quest for the Truth of life. If we do so, we shall surely see the Light and our nation will become great. Amen. Send O Lord, holy apostles into your Church!

PARISH FINANCE REPORT: The financial year 2016/17 has been an exceptionally expensive year for the Parish and, for a number of reasons, we are heading for a deficit of about £20,000 this year. That is an unprecedented and

alarming figure. You have all put a lot of effort in over the last few years to dig our Parish out of the overdraft we had five years ago but our small surplus is now being wiped out. There are a number of reasons but the major costs are for supply priests during Canon Tony's absence, no Parish Funds Appeals whilst he has been away and urgent electrical and fire safety works required following a health & safety survey by the Diocese. We do hope that this is an exceptional year with a number of special factors and our normal break even pattern will resume next year but we need to do something about it now. There will therefore be **a special Parish Funds Appeal collection at all masses next weekend on 28 and 29 January 2017** and I am sure you will all be as generous as you have been in the past.
