In today's Gospel the Pharisees and Herodians join forces in order to entrap Jesus, an example of, 'The enemy of my enemy is my friend', as the Pharisees and Herodians hated each other. The trap is simple; if Jesus says taxes should be paid he can be called a traitor, if he replies that they shouldn't be paid he is a rebel. His response surprises them all and they are left speechless. But what did Jesus mean? At first glance it is an encouragement to separate the secular and religious worlds, an idea probably popular with those who think religion involves one hour a week in church leaving the rest of the week to do whatever we feel like. If we dig more deeply we could bring in the book of Genesis. The denarius in the Gospel carries the image of Caesar, we are created, 'In the image and likeness of God'. We also have the gift of free will, so that our daily task is to nurture that image we carry such that it becomes clearer and clearer, giving back to God what is God's. Genesis also has, in the same place, the God-given command to care for the earth, develop it well, which neatly infuses our superficially secular lives with a religious imperative. Thus, attending church on a Sunday draws together all the events of the previous week so that they are offered to God in Mass while at the same time preparing us to go forth and consecrate the coming week.
