Pope Pius XI released an encyclical Quas Primas -in the first. In this encyclical, the pope inaugurates the feast we celebrate today Christ the universal king! When he is enthroned in our lives no matter the trial or challenge, he reigns and his reign brings ultimate justice, love and peace. Jesus alone is the universal King, come, let us worship him. Fr. Due to the latest Government restrictions, we are currently not able to gather for public worship from 5^{th} November to 2^{nd} December. During this time, Fr. Paschal and I will continue to celebrate Mass separately each day at 8.15_{am} without a congregation; Mass intentions will be published for each Mass in the weekly newsletter. The Church will open daily (Mon-Sun) from 10.00_{am} to 11.00_{am} for individual prayer and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Thank you to all our volunteer Stewards, as without you this would not be possible. *Fr. Chris*

Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment:-

- Churches will open 15 minutes before start of Private Prayer
- Entrance to Church will be via the main door, exit by the side door
- Hand sanitiser is available at entrance and exit, though you may bring your own
- It will be essential that people sit where they are asked and do not move from there
