St. Paul, in his introduction to his letter to the Romans, proclaims that his apostolic mission is to preach the 'obedience of faith'. What does this mean? It is quite simple yet challenging. To have faith means a person is committed to Christ, not just as mere words but as action. As St. James points out, faith without works is dead. A person shows what they believe by what they do, a good tree produces good fruit as Jesus tells us. The call to repentance, which runs throughout Advent, is the call to a way of life which truly expresses the Gospel in action. Hence the weeks of Advent, a time during which we can reflect on our lives, comparing them with Christ's life, repenting on what is at odds with the Gospel and so being more prepared to celebrate Christmas, the coming of God-with-us. It would be especially worthwhile to think about how we are planning to 'celebrate Christmas', in tune with the world about us or with the Gospel? Fr. Chris
