THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT (C)

Week Commencing 23rd March 2025

In this week's second reading St. Paul reminds us of the frequent grumbling of the Israelites in the desert. I think it is true to say that in all their wanderings they never seemed to thank God for liberating them from the Egyptians, they just grumbled about what they had supposedly lost. Their grumbling was based on a false view of their time in Egypt, Thus, they remembered the apparently rich and varied diet they enjoyed (did they really have so much food?) while ignoring the reality of slavery and the killing of the male children. When they reached the promised land their grumbling reached a climax we could say in their refusal to enter it, their attitude seemed to be it was too much trouble. I would suggest that all of us have met a grumbler, someone who just can't seem to have a balanced view of life, balanced in the sense of reasonably accurate. They attend to what they believe is wrong or inconvenient while ignoring the good. Pope Francis warns us often about the dangers of gossiping, I think grumbling isn't far behind.
