Laudato Si' Chapter 6

Concluding the Holy Father's encyclical, we read: "Many things have to change course, but it is we human beings above all who need to change. We lack an awareness of our common origin, of our mutual belonging, and of a future to be shared with everyone." He writes of a collective selfishness fuelled by consumerism. Then: "It becomes almost impossible to accept the limits imposed by reality." (#204) Striking a positive note, "No system can completely suppress our openness to what is good, true and beautiful, or our God-given ability to respond to his grace at work deep in our hearts." (#205) Nevertheless, quoting Pope Emeritus Benedict: "The external deserts in the world are growing, because the internal deserts have become so vast". (Benedict XVI, Homily for the Solemn Inauguration of the Petrine Ministry 24 April 2005). For this reason, argues Pope Francis, the ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion. He appeals for a healthy humility and happy sobriety in a simpler life-style.

"It is in the Eucharist that all that has been created finds its greatest exaltation. Grace, which tends to manifest itself tangibly, found unsurpassable expression when God himself became man and gave himself as food for his creatures." (#236) The pope emphasises Sunday as a day of rest, for healing our relationships with God and ourselves. "Contemplative rest" is not unproductive and Sunday should be centred on the Eucharist. He emphasises Mary, "Mother and Queen of all creation" (#241) and St Joseph "He too can teach us how to show care; he can inspire us to work with generosity and tenderness in protecting this world which God has entrusted to us." (#242)
