A simple and very familiar idea from the readings this Sunday (among other possibilities). We are asked to hear the Word of God and hearing it, put it into practice. It sounds straightforward and rather obvious. Yet we aren't always very successful in the 'practice' bit. In varying degrees, practice can be delayed or, if begun, fade away. For example, we decide to spend more time in prayer, and perhaps do for a while, and then other things intrude and we gradually go back to where we were before. What pulls us back? Technically, we can call them 'needs', which could be understood as mental habits, ways of behaving built up over time. Key to change is humility, recognising what is happening. The support, and challenge, of others is invaluable as they may well see in us what we cannot see ourselves. A suggested prayer – Lord that I may see (referring to oneself!).

Despite all the restrictions, let us be thankful that we can once again gather together, despite social distancing, as God's people. Please note the following norms which remain in place in order to promote a COVID 19 safe environment:-

- Churches will open 15 minutes before start of Mass
