Dear Friends,

'How many apostles there were? Which fruit did Eve pick in the Garden of Eden? Did Paul fall off his horse on the road to Damascus?'

If we are honest, many of us struggle with finding the right answers about our faith when we are asked, especially if we are asked questions which are more important than the ones I quoted. The second readings at Sunday Mass the last few weeks, from the first letter of St. Peter, are about Christian witness and suffering. When we are asked about our faith, we can sometimes feel embarrassed to speak about what we believe or we can feel unsure of how to answer. The important thing to do is to talk and be led by the Holy Spirit, and if we really do not know about something, we can always check and get back to the person asking. If our faith brings us suffering, then St. Peter tells us to be glad because we 'will enjoy a much greater gladness when his glory is revealed.' If anyone wants to look up the answers to the questions above then stop reading! There were 14 apostles. Judas was originally counted as one of the twelve, and after his death, Mathias was chosen. After this. St. Paul called himself the 'apostle to the Gentiles' in Romans 11:13. That makes fourteen in total. Eve is commonly shown with an apple in Eden but Genesis only says that she ate fruit from the tree of knowledge. Paul is often depicted in art falling from a horse on the road to Damascus but in Acts it only says that he fell to the ground: it doesn't mention that he was on a horse!
